Highlights of the July 2019 Parish Council Meeting

Ward Councillor: Jonathan Lester updated us on activity at Herefordshire Council following the local elections and resultant change of control. A major concern is the possible cancellation of Hereford's Western bypass which would have a seriously negative impact on the County's future economy and wellbeing. No decision has yet been taken.

Planning: New planning applications have been submitted to Herefordshire Council as follows:

Ref. 191780 - 2 storey side extension at 1 Newtown Cottages

Ref. 191217 - Reconfiguration of the The Granary at Monksbury Court Barns which is currently undeveloped

Ref. 191994 - Retrospective planning application for a mobile home at Orchard View, Newtown following issuance of an enforcement notice

Ref. 192203 - Rear extension at Court End, Monkhide

The Parish Council's has submitted its comments on each application and these can be accessed through Herefordshire Council's planning website.

Litter Pick: It was suggested that an appropriate date for our next litter pick might be Sunday 17th November. Undertaking this on a Sunday would be a departure from normal practice, but may encourage more residents to help with this important task. Full details will be issued in due course.

Changes in Septic Tank Legislation from 2020: Despite expressing our concern to Herefordshire Council's Environmental Health Department given the cost and impracticality to residents of having to replace existing septic tanks, they have disappointingly simply referred us to the Environment Agency. This will be followed up. As mentioned previously, we encourage members of the community to seek their own advice on this matter.

Monkhide sewage treatment works: Welsh Water has confirmed that this plant will be exempt from the changes in legislation. While it operates using normal bacterial breakdown, the process is assisted by air that is blown into the chamber therefore qualifying it as a treatment plant rather than septic tank. There are apparently hundreds of these across the UK serving individual or small groups of houses. The company has provided us with a short fact sheet about the type of unit installed and if anyone would like a copy, please contact Sallyanne, our Parish Clerk. It's not for the faint hearted!

Neighbourhood Development Plan: Parish Council's in Herefordshire are coming under increasing pressure to demonstrate that they are delivering on their housing commitments and, as a result, it is important that Yarkhill is able to demonstrate that its NDP continues to be fit for purpose. This will be discussed in more detail at the September PC meeting.

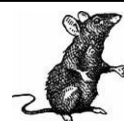
